



WHERE KINDNESS AND SCIENCE COMBINE.

There is little about the Ontario Hospital to indicate its purpose. Nothing in common with the popular idea of an insane asylum. The accompanying pictures, taken this week by The Advertiser photographer, convey some idea of this modern institution. The large picture in the upper row shows one of the sunrooms, it has been one of Dr. Robinson's policies to build sunrooms and balconies wherever possible. The doctor believes fresh air and sunshine are the best assistants he can enlist in his work. Next is shown a section of the room where violent patients are treated by the continuous bath. They are not strapped or put in irons. Simply put in a sort of hammock that floats in a large tub, the temperature of which is regulated so that it stays between 96 and 98 degrees.
