¹ **redemptor, redemptoris:** redeemer ² **ostendo, ostendere, ostendi, ostentus:** to show ³ **partus, -us**, M: birth, offspring ⁴ **virgo, virginis**, F: virgin, maiden ⁵ **miror, mirari, miratus** (deponent): to wonder, marvel, be amazed; here, *jussive subjunctive*, 'Let ... be amazed' ⁶ **saeculum, -i**, N: age, time, race ⁷ **talis, tale** (adj.): such ⁸ **decet:** befits, becomes ⁹ **virilis, virile**, (adj.): manly, virile ¹⁰ **semen, seminis**, N: seed ¹¹ **mysticus, -a, um:** mysterious ¹² **spiramen, spiraminis**, N: breath, wind, spirit ¹³ **caro, carnis**, F: flesh ¹⁴ **fructus, -us**, M: fruit ¹⁵ **venter, ventris:** womb, belly ¹⁶ **floreo, florere, florui:** to flourish, blossom ¹⁷ **alvus, -i:** belly, womb ¹⁸ **tumesco, tumescere, tumesci:** to (begin to) swell ¹⁹ **claustum, -i**, N: bolt, barrier ²⁰ **pudor, pudoris**, M: modesty, decency, shame ²¹ **permaneo, permanere, permansi, permanens:** to remain ²² **vexillum, -i**, N: banner ²³ **virtus, virtutis**, F: virtue ²⁴ **mico** (1): to shine ²⁵ **versor** (1): (here) to dwell (deponent) ²⁶ **reno, renonis**, M: reindeer (pelt) ²⁷ **nasus, -i:** nose ²⁸ **rubrinatus—ruber, -ra, -rum:** red, ruddy ²⁹ **nitidus, -a, um:** shining, bright ³⁰ **umquam** (adv.): ever ³¹ **niteo, nitere, nitui:** to shine, glow ³² **dirideo, diridere derisi, derisus:** to mock, deride ³³ **rideo, ridere, risi, risus:** to laugh, ridicule, laugh at ³⁴ **sino, sinere, sivi, situs:** to allow, permit (an 'accusative' to 'infinitive') ³⁵ **ludo, ludere, lusi, lusus:** to play ³⁶ **Iudus, -i:** game, sport ³⁷ **natal, natalis**, M: birthday ³⁸ **nubilus, -a, um:** cloudy ³⁹ **traha, -ae:** a vehicle without wheels, sled ⁴⁰ **hilare** (adv.): happily, cheerfully ⁴¹ **annalis, -is:** chronicle, history ⁴² **adsum** (ad + sum): to be present, to be near ⁴³ **fidelis, -e** (adj.): faithful ⁴⁴ **triumpho** (1): to triumph ⁴⁵ **adoro** (1): to adore (here, *jussive subjunctive*, 'let us ...') ⁴⁶ **parturio, -ire, parturivi:** to bring forth, to bive birth ⁴⁷ **gigno, gignere, genui, genitus:** to bear, beget
